DESCRIPTION:

This is an important position involving technical laboratory work responsible for independently performing and supervising the chemical, physical, and bacteriological collection and analysis of samples including liquid and solid sewage and industrial wastes, etc. Work is performed under the supervision of the Permit Compliance Manager and in accordance with prescribed laboratory procedures. Supervision is exercised over the work of subordinate laboratory technicians. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: EITHER

- A. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in chemistry, biology, bacteriology, microbiology or medical technology, laboratory technology, or closely related fields and two (2) years of laboratory experience in the analysis of biological materials or water or wastewater; OR,
- B. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered two (2) year college with an Associate's Degree in chemistry, biology, bacteriology, microbiology, medical technology, laboratory technology, or closely related fields and four (4) years of experience as noted in A above.

Candidates will not have to take an exam for this title. This is a Hiring Emergency Limited Placement (HELP) Programdesignated title. The HELP Program is a temporary program designed to help local government employers address current staffing issues. Traditionally, the titles filled under the HELP Program required job candidates to compete in a competitive exam to be considered for employment. For the duration of the program, this title will be classified as non-competitive and categorized as a "HELP Program" position. At the close of the program, this position will revert to competitive class status. Employees occupying positions filled through the HELP Program will be granted competitive class status without the need to participate in a competitive exam.
